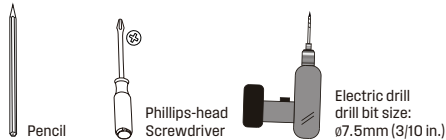


INSTRUCTIONS

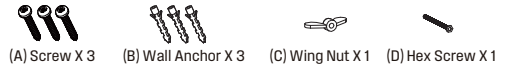
FOR FIRST TIME USE: SOLAR LIGHT NEEDS TO CHARGE IN FULL SUNLIGHT FOR 8 -12 HOURS WITH THE SWITCH IN THE "ON" POSITION TO FULLY CHARGE THE BATTERY.

INSTALLATION

Tools Required



Hardware Included



Parts



- Carefully remove the fixture from the carton and check that all parts are included. Be careful not to misplace any of the screws or parts needed for installing the fixture.
- Insert the extension arm (G) into the side access of the lamp (E). Put the hex screw (D) through the opening with the recessed hex hole. Secure and tighten with wing nut (C). (Figure 1)

- Align the holes on each side of the lens/reflector (F) with the screws (H) on each side of the lamp (E) and attach the lens/reflector (F) to the lamp (E) and turn the lens/reflector (F) to lock in place and tighten the screws (H). (Figure 2)

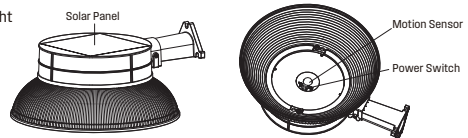
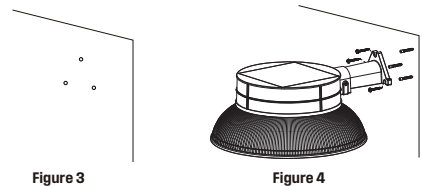
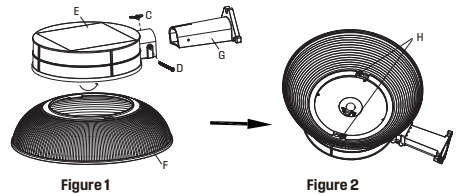
NOTE: Screws (H) should be pre-threaded on lamp (E).

- Locate the light fixture 6.5 feet (2 m) at least above ground on a solid surface capable of supporting the light fixture and secure enough so that it will not move when exposed to vibrations or wind. The light fixture must be high enough to allow for motion detection and light distribution. (Figure 3)

- Mark the hole locations of the light fixture then set the light fixture aside. Check that the marked areas are clear of obstacles such as cables and electrical lines. Drill holes for the enclosed screws and wall anchors. Insert the wall anchors then secure the light fixture in place with the screws. (Figure 4)

Slide the light power switch to "ON" position, the light will turn on automatically at night when motion is detected.

- Light delivers up to 4000 lumens on a full charge.
- Standby mode 100 lumens.
- Motion Sensor Detection Distance up to 16 feet (5 m).
- Motion Sensor Detection angle up to 120 degrees.



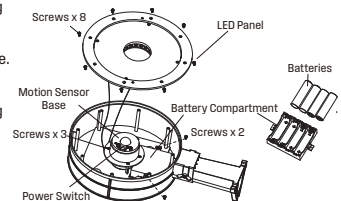
TROUBLE SHOOTING

If light doesn't turn on, check the battery to ensure that it is making secure contact with the terminals. If this doesn't work, replace with a new battery.

REPLACING THE BATTERY

- Slide the power switch to the "OFF" position.
- Use a Phillips head screwdriver to remove the 8 screws holding the LED panel in place.
- Remove the 3 screws holding the motion sensor base in place.
- Remove the 2 screws holding the battery compartment in place.
- Pull up and replace old batteries with 4 new 3.7V, 2000 mAh lithium (18650) rechargeable batteries.
- Replace the battery compartment and the LED panel by aligning them properly and replacing the 13 screws removed earlier.
- Slide the power switch to the "ON" position.

For optimal performance, allow light fixture to charge in full sunlight for 8-12 hours, to fully charge the battery.
